All volunteer time will be logged in the volunteer book found at the garden. Time is logged under the main gardener name.

Your hours or your dollars

Why does BFCG use \$25 as the monetary equivalence of one hour of volunteer time? We use the calculation of Independent Sector (IndependentSector.org), long recognized as the prime source for state and national data on the value of volunteer time in the U.S.



[TLDR-]The assumption is that their equivalence represents the cost to the organization of hiring

paid workers to provide these services. It is not based on the amount that volunteers may earn in their paid occupations, but on the cost (or value) of the services they provide.

Their number is first based on the annual average hourly earnings for production and non-supervisory workers on private non-farm payrolls (OK, so there may be a bit of irony that they exclude farm workers whose earnings are less). Estimates come from the Current Employment Statistics (CES) database from the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). Their methodology takes into account fringe benefits as well. [-TLDR]

Independent Sector announced in April 2023 that the latest (2022) value of a volunteer hour is estimated to be \$31.80 nationally, \$29.17 for Ohio. Hence, BFCG \$25/hr.

Putting a number to your volunteer time doesn't do you justice. We, everyone in our gardening community, appreciate your dedication to our garden. We value your time and talent and know it can't be quantified. Whether it's hours or dollars we hope that you find satisfaction in contributing to the stewardship, improvement, and preservation of our special place.
